From Pastor Mike....

As I write this article, I am aware that Lent is approximately half-way over. Being a season where one is challenged to face their mortality, I am also aware of many situations and circumstances that point out my humanness and frailty. Some of these situations are personal with me and my family and others are circumstances that I am walking through with friends and church members. We all are mindful of the fact that life is difficult at times. And if we are being truthful, very seldom are we truly in control of the outcomes and resolutions of the many things we face. As I contemplate this reality, I am reminded of a passage of scripture from Paul's letter to the Romans. It reads as follows: "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39) Now, I realize this is not a scripture that one would normally classify as an Easter passage but I as I face the remainder of Lent, I am convinced that it speaks the very heart of Easter.

The message of Easter is that God wanted a way to share His love for creation in a powerful manner that would draw all people to Him. His desire was to live in a loving relationship that would allow His grace and love to transform our lives. To make this relationship a reality, God knew that the price for sins committed would have to be settled. Mankind needed a Redeemer, one who could pay that price and reconcile our account. Since humankind was not able to accomplish that on its own, God sent "His only begotten son" to be the spotless lamb that would take away the sins of the world by his selfless sacrifice. Of all the world religions no other has a God who came and died as in a substitutionary sacrifice for mere mortals. God wanted his creation to understand His deep love that would go to any length and depth for a hurting and lost people. So, Jesus came and died on a cruel cross in a horrendous manner.

But dying for us was not enough – God went an extra step. God raised Jesus from the dead and allowed him to walk out of that lifeless cold dark tomb. Once and for all God proved that His power and love were the most powerful of all forces. More powerful than death! More powerful than all the principalities and powers of evil! More powerful than even time itself – past, present, and future! God proved His power was enough to save a sinner like me and transform my life and yours. He gives us a calling that brings a mission and purpose to our existence. He provides a power to become all He called us to be and become. I have a feeling that this is a truth that can transform Lent and our struggle with our mortality into a beautiful expression of God's peace and presence. So Yes, this is an Easter scripture. And Yes, we serve a risen savior. And Yes, we can know without a shadow of a doubt that **NOTHING** can ever separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus. This promise is truly the gift of Easter. He is risen! He is risen indeed!

Gaye is an award-winning artist with commissioned portraits in both private and public collections worldwide. Since childhood, Gaye has always loved to create. After studying art at Asbury University, she served with the Methodist Board of Global Ministries as a missionary in Zaire, Africa. When her children entered middle school, Gaye began evening classes to complete her degree. She earned her BS in Industrial/Organizational Psychology, with an Art Minor, from High Point University, graduating Magna Cum Laude and named to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities. She worked as a Social Worker and Grief Counselor with Hospice of Randolph County before returning to her love of art and becoming a full-time artist in the year 2000.

Gaye possesses a heart devoted to challenging the church to be transformed through a life-changing encounter with God. She is the co-founder of Living Legacy Ministries which "exists to point people to Christ through any means available at any given time." As an artist, she has proclaimed the Deity of Christ through a series of Christmas paintings, most notably, "Every Knee Shall Bow". Her testimony of God's faithfulness while under captivity by Angolan rebels will inspire and renew your faith. Gaye's desire to equip believers with the spiritual disciplines necessary to embolden this generation to stand for Truth in a culture strife with uncertainty and unbelief is evidenced through her artwork and trainings. Gaye is the author of Common Sense Christianity for an Uncommon People; Every Knee Shall Bow- A Christmas Collection and is the author/illustrator of five children's books. Her studio is located in Trinity, North Carolina, where she resides with her husband, Eddie. They share five children and fourteen grandchildren.
