### From Pastor Mike....

One of the themes we find in the scriptures, both the Old Testament and the New Testament, is that God desires to live in "COVENANT" with His people. One of the strongest declarations of this comes from Luke 22:20, "And in the same way He took the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood." We recognize this scripture from the story of the first Lord's Supper. We know that this passage is built on the foundation of the old covenant given to Abraham when God called him to be the father of a new nation. This new nation would recognize God as their God, see themselves as God's people and would be used by God to bless all of humankind. Later in their history, God would renew this covenant with the Hebrew people by giving Moses a set of rules that would govern their relationship with God and with one another. These rules were the "Ten Commandments". However, the Hebrew people failed miserably in their efforts to follow these rules – either because of their ignorance or because of their arrogance. Many years later the Prophet Jeremiah would tell the people of Israel that a **NEW COVENANT** was coming for their guidance and relationship with God. The major difference in this new covenant is that God would "put My law within them and on their heart, I will write it; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people." (Jeremiah 31:33) The interesting concept here is that the Old Covenant was given to a whole nation and was an attempt to force behavior from the outside, while the New Covenant would be given to individuals who were chosen out of love by God and their response would be one of love for God and loyalty to Him.

We know that this New Covenant was instituted by Jesus Christ in his death on the cross and his resurrection from the grave. Jesus took force out of the equation and replaced it with unconditional love. He does not force us but rather woos us and pursues us to be his Children. For Jesus, salvation was a two-way street of receiving grace and love and then living out of these two gifts from God and sharing them with others.

Jesus called this "Kingdom Living". He incarnated this concept in everything that he did and taught. Kingdom living has two basic foundational ideas:

"Kingdom Living" is an **ABUNDANT** way of living – John 10:10 "Kingdom Living" is living on **EARTH AS IT IS HEAVEN** – Matthew 6:10 (The Lord's Prayer)

One of the greatest expressions of Kingdom Living is found in Matthew 5:1-12. Over the next 9 weeks, we are going to look at these characteristics during morning worship. We will learn that these concepts are not rule and regulations but rather traits that are the natural normal consequences of pursuing the heart and mind of God. I see them as steppingstones to a joyful and Spirit-filled life. Welcome to "THE BEATTITUDES."


