From Pastor Mike....

In June of 2023 when I left Archdale United Methodist Church, I was faced with two major decisions. One decision revolved around trying to find a job so I could pay my bills and provide for my family. The other was that I needed to find a denomination within which I could continue my ministry. I realized that for the first time in over sixty years, I was without denominational standing or opportunity to minister. This was the beginning of a journey to secure credentials and support so I could continue to live my call to be a pastor/minister.

As I began this journey, I built off of the foundational belief that relationships and connection are vital to each Believer. Christianity, in my opinion, should be defined as a transforming relationship with God through Jesus Christ's action on the cross and His resurrection, and then empowered by His Holy Spirit. This relationship with God changes every relationship in my life – family, other believers, friends and acquaintances, and others in my community and society. It is through my connection with God, and Him working in and through me, that He can reach and bring, grace, mercy, and love to bear in their lives. Without that connection to God, I am nothing and I can do nothing. It is imperative, in my way of thinking, for me to be connected to a church of believers who understand this as our call to discipleship. There I find support, help, hope, and like-minded believers to live out my faith and to grow in Christlikeness. Plus, Jesus called me to minister, "in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the uttermost parts of the earth." (Acts 1:8) I personally can't go to all those places but the call from Jesus still remains. The only way I can fulfill my mission is to work in conjunction with others who are around the world. I need a denomination that I can work through and help support others who are already involved in this vital work of the ministry.

After reading and researching several denominations that espouse and are founded on Wesleyan thought and concepts, I realize there were few options available in this area. The largest conservative orthodox denomination was the fledgling Global Methodist Church. I read and studied their doctrinal stance, their church polity and policies, and asked questions of their members. While I felt the GMC was a good fit for me and was a place where I could find ministry opportunities, it was not until I attended their Annual Conference in the fall of 2023 that my decision was made to join them. I had the opportunity to worship with members of the GMC and hear their testimonies of God's work in their lives. I heard the leaders share their vision for this new denomination and felt I had found a home. It was during this conference that I was ordained as an Elder in full connection. I am thankful that God gave me the opportunity to learn, study, and explore my connections and truly feel like the Global Methodist Church is where I need to be.

We currently have a Study Group at Archdale Methodist Church that is reading, studying, and asking questions about our church's denominational stance. In the near future, this group will present the church membership with opportunities to better understand and discuss the GMC. I ask you to pray for this team and pray for our church that we might find the best possible place for our ministry and our continued growth as disciples. I feel we can continue to be and grow stronger as a force for love, mercy, and grace here in our community and unto the uttermost parts of the world.
