From Pastor Mike....

Can you believe that it is already August? I can't. Summer is almost over. School is slated to begin soon, and time is just rushing along. You may be thinking where has the summer gone – there are trips to be taken still, sights yet to be seen, and time is running out. Take a deep breath. There you go and just relax. Yes, time is flying by, but we still have several weeks of summer and even the early fall will be warm enough to trick us into believing summer is hanging around for just a little longer.

This season of anxiousness and hurry reminds us that we must prioritize our actions and attitudes. As we have often heard the old saying, "It is easy to forget that we are supposed to drain the swamp when we are up to our armpits in alligators." This is especially true in attempting to live according to Christ's commands in the kingdom of God. The Old Testament writer Micah tells us to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly before our God." (6:8) But that is hard to do sometimes when we see injustice all around us and hear harsh words that's challenge our faith and gentleness. And it is most difficult to walk humbly in a society that rewards boldness and challenges one to stand one's ground and never give in or give up. Gentleness and kindness are often seen as weaknesses and character flaws.

Even the church and its people are challenged by society and its definitions of ministry and service. It seems that society thinks the goal of the Gospel is to affirm all people, celebrate all people, and accept all people. I believe the goal of the Gospel is to rescue you, transform you, and redirect you. Jesus, in his last words to His disciples, challenged them to "make disciples of others in the process of going about their lives" which he defined as "baptizing and teaching these new disciples all that He had shared with them." (Matthew 28:19-20) I feel Jesus was saying live your life to the fullest but never forget that the priority of your life is sharing the Gospel while serving others with love and grace. I guess the best way to describe this concept is to grow in Christlikeness and love one another, both within the Christian family and in society. That's a difficult task. However, we can achieve it with the help of the indwelling Holy Spirit.

I believe the key to walking in the strength of the Lord comes from focus. We can focus on the troubles and travails around us, or we can keep our eyes fixed on God. Always remember, He loves us unconditionally, gave himself for us in the sacrifice of Jesus, and offers us the power and courage to follow a different path than the one laid out by the world. We may find ourselves up to our armpits with alligators from time to time, but we are **NEVER** alone in the swamp. We always have God. And because of that relationship with God, we always can find strength in one another.
