From Pastor Mike....


Do you ever stop and think about what you do to prepare yourself for worship service on Sunday morning? A popular song says we often "tumble out of bed and stumble to the kitchen, pour yourself a cup of ambition and yawn and stretch and try to come to life." A quick shower and throw on our Sunday clothes and out the door. Sound familiar? Well, that may work for some folks but if you want to have a more harmonious and eventful experience may I offer some suggestions inspired by a recent Facebook post.

As we prepare ourselves for morning worship, I feel we need to include time for some prayer-filled time with God. It is important to not just simply share our recent prayer requests and concerns but to take time to consciously listen to what God may be saying to us. Ask Him what we need to hear during our study and worship time. Ask God to highlight that specific message that is being presented just for us and how it relates to our individual needs and situation. Maybe even a quick visit to the Prayer Chapel can help me prepare my heart and spirit for the morning opportunities.

Sometimes I find that listening to Christian music can help me focus on the particular needs that God will be reminding me about during the worship service. Listening to insightful music can often stimulate areas that I need to open to God through prayer and meditation. I have also found that taking my Bible and referencing scripture being read or taught can open my heart, mind, and spirit to God's leading and enlightenment. It helps my memory to take notes and write down the points that make sense to me. Seems I remember the lessons better and find ways to relate them to my weekly endeavors.

Once you arrive at church and have found your spot for the service, take time to greet those folks around you. If you know them, greet them warmly and reconnect by sharing a friendly visit. If you don't know them, ask their name and make a connection. Welcome them to Archdale Methodist because once the service starts, you don't want to scare them off when you start singing and praising God loudly and enthusiastically. They will be much more likely to join in with the singing if they feel they are surrounded by friends. While you are making a "Happy Racket" and praising God, focus on "ABBA" and all that He has done for you during the past week. If we focus on His blessings to us, it makes the singing easier and so much more fun. I think all these things can help us to get more out of worship and also to put more into it. It is easy to slip into an attitude of just seeing the rest of the folks and enjoying some time with them. It is also easy to just settle into the comfortableness of the service and the routine aspects of what we do. But if the true purpose of worship is to spend some time in God's presence and experience his power and peace, it seems the best thing for us to do is to come expecting Him to do something. Do you really expect God to do something on Sunday mornings to change lives and transform people? Or do you just look forward to "business as usual"? If God is going to move, each one of us must be open to His Spirit's movement, but we must also be willing for Him to move in and through me. This can only happen if I am looking for Him, expecting Him, and am prepared to be his vessel of love and grace to others. Wouldn't it be neat if God were to show up on Sunday morning and used **YOU** to touch someone's life. **I BELIEVE IT CAN HAPPEN. DO YOU?**






SENIOR GAMES MEDALIST
