From Pastor Mike....

I think everyone can agree that society and our world are in a state of constant confusion and chaos. It seems that there are many different world views competing for dominance and priority in these tumultuous times. One concept that seems to be lurking in the shadows is what many call "Secular Humanism." The basic tenets of Secular Humanism are:
